THE QUICK BIO

WITH MUSICAL ROOTS DEEP IN THE SOCIALLY CONSCIOUS 60S/70S, DECADES ON THE STAGE, FOUR ALBUMS AND A SONGWRITER'S TAKE ON WRANGLING AN OMINOUS FUTURE, PETER CAMPBELL'S INFECTIOUS INDIE FOLK HAS TAKEN HIM AROUND THE WORLD BRINGING AUDIENCES UPLIFTING, CHALLENGING AND OFTEN HILARIOUS CALLS TO ACTION, CONNECTION AND HEALING.

Playing 6/12 string guitars and banjo, Pete's music has been an ongoing exploration of his political and environmental concerns alongside the bitter-sweet matters of the human heart. His second album, Across the Border, was produced by folk legend Noel Paul Stookey (Paul of Peter, Paul & Mary fame) at his studio in Blue Hill, Maine, USA. PP&M covered his song Wild Places on their album Such is Love and he supported them on their 1982 Australian Tour.

In the words of his own song Pete has willingly carried a Burden of Hope for nearly 60 years. Over 15 years of writing, performing and travelling as a solo artist, an authentic and distinctive voice evolved, charged with honesty, activism, human emotion, humour and personal politics. 35 years later the world has changed but there is a timelessness to this music - anthems written for the fight for the Franklin River and the Peace Movement find new relevance and momentum in a disturbing world. They are joined by new, passionate calls for action on the environment, indigenous rights and social justice, deeply human cries for family, compassion and connection alongside heartfelt reflections from lived experience. It is strong music with a beating heart.

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In 2020 he wrote Waited Too Long which became the anthem for the United Nations International Summit on Domestic/Family Violence in the COVID-19 Era, a three-day online conference out of New York attended by leaders and experts from 47 countries, and opened by the Pope.

In 2022, urged on by the response to Waited Too Long, Pete was convinced to return to the stage bringing with him a wealth of new music which has never been heard.

Peter has the thrilling knack of empathy that enables him to move inside people's states of mind so that he is not singing about them, but about himself as one of them – singing on behalf of them. It's a rare gift...

In 2023 the inaugural Bundanoon Folk Festival became the platform from which Pete leapt back into the music that sustained him most of his life. As he says himself - take them by surprise; give them something to remember.

He certainly did that.

He is a lost GEM! Where has this man been on the music scene all these years? I was stunned by the magic of his voice and playing, and the conviction of his politics. He has been a shocking loss to the folk scene.
